COVID-19 Update

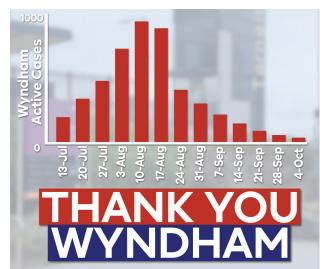
Daily updates on all coronavirus related news are posted on my Facebook page which can be found here.

The last couple of months have been a challenge for many Victorians. At the height of the pandemic, Wyndham experienced 942 active cases - but through hard work and persistence we've driven the numbers down.

Second Step - Roadmap to Recovery

From September 28th, metro Melbourne has taken the second step on our roadmap to a COVID-normal setting.

Key changes to the roadmap include:

- You may leave home for the same four reasons as Stage 3 (essentials shopping, exercise, caregiving, work and education).
- Curfew is no longer in effect.
- Childcare will reopen for all children with permits no longer required. Babysitting will also be allowed.
- Onsite learning will resume for VCE and Primary school students (see following page).
- Religious gatherings can also take place outdoors with five people plus a faith leader. You can only travel up to 5km from your home to attend a gathering and only for 2 hours.
- Pet grooming is allowed on commercial premises. You may travel more than 5km for pet grooming.
- Face fitted masks are now required. This means that other forms of masks bandanas, scarves and faceshields will no longer be allowed. Victorians will have a week to obtain a face-fitted mask.

GRANGE RESERVE LIGHTING \$350,000 - COMPLETE

The Hoppers Crossing Soccer Club will now be able to play and practice at night, with the installation of lights at Grange Reserve being completed this month.

This is fantastic news for the Hoppers Crossing Soccer Club, who are looking forward to playing their first night game under light at Grange Reserve in the early months of next year.

The Andrews Government provided \$300,000 for these lights as part of a 2018 election commitment - the remainder being provided by Wyndham City Council.

Community Sport will return soon as restrictions continue to ease.

Year 12 Engagement - VCE & VCAL

Last month, I commenced a series of virtual roundtables with Year 12 student leaders from across all secondary schools in the Tarneit Electorate. These roundtables have provided students with an opportunity for in-depth discussions about the pandemic and its impacts on our community, as well as discussing what their graduation will be like this year, and most importantly, what jobs will be available for them once this pandemic is over.

Additionally, I have also setup a Young Women's Roundtable with senior students across Tarneit to discuss gender equality and issues facing young women. These roundtables allow women to discuss issues relating to the workplace, family violence and sexual harassment.

It was great to hear from these bright, talented young students - I look forward to continuing these sessions into the future.

Garrang Wilam Primary School

The Victorian Government made a commitment to deliver 100 new schools between 2019 and 2026 - and we're getting on with it.

Our newest school, known in the interim as Truganina South East Primary School, has officially been named Garrang Wilam Primary following community consultation.

Garrung Wilam is a local Aboriginal word meaning 'eucalyptus home'. Incorporated into the schools branding will be the vibrant work of indigenous artist Deanne Gilson. Deanne's artwork symbolises elders and students focused together on learning with colours reflecting the Western Volcanic Plains, native plants, and eucalyptus trees that inhabited the lands.



Garrang Wilam Primary School is due to open its doors in 2021 and enrolments are now open.

Rental Relief - Residential & Commercial

We have introduced a fair system to support tenants and landlords during the pandemic.

This includes a \$80 million fund whereby tenants can receive financial assistance in paying their rent after they go through a mediation process with their landlord.
